

ZOSTAVAX (shingles shot)



The Braintree Health Department has received a very limited quantity of state supplied zoster vaccine ("shingles shot") to administer free of charge to **UNINSURED** adults, 60 years of age and older.

If a resident is 65 and older but does **not** have Medicare Part D, they can be considered uninsured and receive the free, state supplied vaccine. The vaccine is limited to those residents who are either uninsured or whose insurance does not cover the vaccine.

Helpful Reminders.....Please remember that all recyclable items must be inside the cart to ensure pickup. Cardboard boxes should be flattened, and, if needed, cut into a size that will fit into the cart.

If you have a very large appliance box, the delivery person should take back the cardboard or any packing. This is a regular service with most appliances and furniture deliveries.

Please note that trash extra bags/barrels that are in addition to the Town issued cart will not be picked up.

Items that are acceptable to place outside of the cart are noted on the lid of the recycling cart.

The occasional extra 2-3 bags of trash or recycling can be brought to the appropriate container at the Recycling Center.
