


BRAINTREE BEAUTIFICATION DAY and the Herring Run Celebration!

With close to 175 volunteers we collected 2900lbs of trash or 1.5 tons! Many volunteers took the opportunity to go check out the Monaquot River fish ladder throughout the day and saw the historic run of the herring up stream. If you haven't gotten out to see the fish ladder yet, be sure to take a trip down there by the end of May as the herring finish their migration to the Great Pond Reservoir! HYDRANT FLUSHING

May through August

The Town of Braintree has begun our annual flushing program. This means that all the hydrants in the Town are flushed out. Sediment accumulates in the mains and flushing rids the piping of this sediment. This allows us to ensure that the hydrants are working properly.

You may experience dirty water during this period, and we ask for your patience and understanding during the process. Flushing will take place Monday through Thursday from 7PM to 4AM and should have a minimal effect on the water distribution system.



- Avoid doing laundry during these hours and always check to ensure that your water is running clear before resuming laundry activities.
- If you experience discolored water then run your COLD water until it runs clear.

TRASH FEE UPDATES

The Treasurer/Collector's Office, along with the Trash & Recycling and Water & Sewer Departments, have increased their fees to help reduce their budget shortfalls over the next few years. As presented during last years budget this increase marks the second increase, of three to cover the gap in trash collection costs.
