PRESCRIPTION DRUGS & SHARPS (NO CHARGE): Medications should be in original containers & information voided. Medications can also be brought to the Police Department's Lobby kiosk at any time. (Police Department does not accept needle/syringes.) Needles/syringes are accepted in red sharps containers only. They are accepted at this event or can be dropped off at the Health Department Office at Town Hall (781-794-8090).

Spring Yard Waste Collection 2022

Weeks of: April 18, 25, May 2, 9, 16, & May 23 (is the final week).

Curbside yard waste will be picked up on your regular trash day. **Please have curbside prior to 7AM.**

Place leaves, grass clippings & twigs (less than 1") into brown paper leaf bags, or open barrels (no lids please). Plastic bags will be rejected curbside, but can be **emptied out** at 225 Plain St. (Drop-Off Compost Site). Branches & shrubs can be dropped off also, but no root balls. The site is open Wed. - through Sun. 7:15AM - 2:45PM from mid-April 2022 - Jan. 31, 2021. Due to warm weather may be open earlier extra days prior to April. Call 781-794-8955 for information. Call for Winter Hours, post January 31. **Trash Sticker Required.**
